HOUSE OF MARBLES

Quirky, nostalgic, and full of surprises, House of Marbles is a must-visit for groups looking for something a little different. Explore intricate marble runs, watch skilled glassblowers in action, and wander through eclectic displays that spark curiosity and conversation.

At House of Marbles, your group can explore:

- Fascinating marble runs and vintage games
- Glassblowing demonstrations
- Quirky museums and gift shops

It's a great icebreaker activity—lighthearted, nostalgic, and perfect for all ages.

Plan around 1–1.5 hours here to explore at a relaxed pace.

They also have a lovely café which can accommodate group dining.

MAKE SOUTHWEST

A hub of contemporary craft set in a stunning historic mill, MAKE Southwest offers an inspiring glimpse into the South West's creative talent.

From beautifully curated exhibitions to a shop filled with handmade pieces, it's the perfect place for groups to browse, discover, and take home something truly unique.

MAKE Southwest offers:

- Contemporary craft exhibitions (ceramics, textiles, jewellery)
- A beautiful shop featuring handmade pieces
- Occasional live demonstrations and workshops

For groups, this adds a creative and inspiring contrast to the morning's fun. Spend about 45–60 minutes browsing and soaking up the atmosphere.

LUNCH & SHOPPING

Bovey Tracey offers a relaxed and characterful shopping experience, centred around its independent high street.

From artisan crafts and locally made gifts to galleries and speciality shops, it's the perfect place for groups to browse at their own pace and discover something unique.

- **Lunch** at a local pub, café, or traditional tearoom (perfect for a Devon cream tea)
- **Independent shopping**, including artisan goods, gifts, and local produce

This flexible window works well for groups—people can wander, shop, and regroup.

Round off the structured part of your day with a unique local experience. For a true taste of Dartmoor, a visit to Dartmoor Whisky Distillery delivers a warm and memorable experience.

Learn about the craft behind the spirit and enjoy a guided tasting—perfect for rounding off the day with a local flavour and a touch of indulgence.

At Dartmoor Whisky Distillery, your group can:

- Learn about the whisky-making process
- Enjoy a guided tasting session
- Discover the story behind this local producer

This is ideal for adult groups and adds a premium, memorable touch to the day. Plan for 1–1.5 hours.

IF TIME ALLOWS...

Finish with:

- A relaxed drink at a local pub
- Or a short stroll towards **Dartmoor** for fresh air and views – Bovey Tracey is located approx. 3 miles from Haytor.
- Bovey Tracey is also located near **Trago Mills Shopping Park**.

COACH PARKING

The primary option for coach access is:

- **Station Road Car Park:**
 - Widely referenced as the designated coach parking area in Bovey Tracey
 - Located close to the town centre and within walking distance of key attractions
 - Suitable for coach parking and longer stays

This is your best all-round option for groups visiting multiple venues in town.

TOWN CENTRE DROP-OFF POINTS

For quick unloading before parking, coaches can use central roadside areas such as:

- Near De Tracey Park (bus stop area)
- Along Fore Street / town centre high street (where safe and permitted)

These are ideal for:

- Dropping groups close to MAKE Southwest, shops, and cafés
- Allowing easier access for less mobile passengers

Important: These are short stay only – coaches should move to a car park after drop-off.
