Day One:

9:00

Arrive at the award-winning Royal Albert Memorial Museum to explore 16 galleries, including collections from around the world dating from pre-historic times to the present day. Don't forget to pop into the RAMM Café for a pit-stop and the RAMM gift shop – for a souvenir to take home with you!

12:00

Treat yourself to a tasty lunch at a unique restaurant or café in Exeter, give Tea on the Green a try for heart-warming dishes or enjoy a light lunch at Lloyd's Lounge for a stylish experience!

13:30

Catch a matinee performance at Exeter Northcott Theatre, Cygnet Theatre or Exeter Barnfield. Whether you're after a drama, a comedy or a musical, the theatre scene in the city is bursting with choice!

16:00

Browse through collections at the Bill Douglas Cinema Museum at the University of Exeter, which houses the largest collection of items relating to the moving image. You'll have the opportunity to explore toys, artefacts and memorabilia from the seventeenth century to the present day.

17:30

Grab some dinner at The Old Firehouse in the city centre, a key part of Exeter's nightlife, food and culture. Be sure to order a pizza, they're a local favourite!

19:30

Arrive at the Exeter Corn Exchange just as the doors open to your evening show. This popular venue hosts various events from music, to comedy to dance!


Day Two:
