The #95 bus is the perfect way to get to World of Country Life, a family-owned visitor attraction filled with a huge array of animals. Opened in 1978, it has an eclectic mix of museums, animals, play areas and entertainment both indoors and under cover, making an excellent day out, whatever the weather.

EXMOUTH BEACH

The beautiful sandy beach is perfect for summer days at the seaside, building sandcastles, beachcombing, swimming or playing in the rockpools. Exmouth is known as a regional centre for watersports, particularly kite surfing, kayaking, paddleboarding and windsurfing. A new watersports centre, Sideshore, opening in 2020 will be the place to take part or to simply sit and watch the amazing activities and sports on offer. Alternatively, you can take a scenic boat trip, listed as one of the 'top family attractions in Devon'. Cruise the beautiful River Exe or see the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site which dates back over 250 million years.



Exmouth has one of the country's best cycle and walkway paths: the Exe Estuary Trail (part of the National Cycle Route 2) towards Exeter.

Boasting stunning views of the estuary, this cycling and walking path is hugely popular, passing many wildlife spots, coastal villages and towns. Bikes are available for hire in the town centre. In the other direction, along the coastline, the South West Coast Path offers gentle walking out of Exmouth as it enters the East Devon National Landscape. On the Coast Path at Orcombe Point, at the end of Exmouth Beach, you'll pass the Geoneedle which marks the beginning of the Jurassic Coast World Heritage Site.

FOOD & DRINK

Exmouth in Devon is a fantastic spot for groups looking to enjoy great food and drink. The town offers a mix of charming cafes, traditional pubs, and contemporary restaurants, all set against the stunning backdrop of the Exe Estuary. Seafood is a highlight, with fresh catches served up daily in local eateries. For drinks, head to one of the beachfront bars for a pint or a cocktail with a view. Whether it's a casual fish and chips or a gourmet meal, Exmouth has plenty to offer for a memorable group dining experience.

EVENTS

COACH PARKING

Exmouth has a dedicated town centre coach drop off point at 22 The Strand, EX8 1AG with coach parking nearby at the Estuary Lorry and Car Park, EX8 1EN (just 3-minute walk from the town centre).

There are numerous <u>public toilets</u> conveniently located around the town centre and sea front. Most are easily accessible and offer disabled amenities.

The Tourist Information Service is also located in the Strand near to the <u>coach drop off point</u>. Exmouth Tourist Information offer a meet and greet service for your group. This can be prebooked by calling their office on 01395 830550.

- Coming from Exeter, head into Exmouth on the A376
- At the roundabout, just past M&S and Exmouth Train Station, take the 2nd exit
- At the mini roundabout, take the 1st exit onto Imperial Road
- Take the 1st left-hand turn onto Victoria Road
- At the bottom of Victoria Road you will see straight ahead of you a bus stop dedicated for coaches only.


