Glimpse further into the region's past by heading to the award-winning family friendly **Tiverton Museum of Mid Devon** Life, full of quirky exhibits.

Tiverton has plenty of great attractions and things to see and do for groups visiting the area!

Tiverton Museum of Mid Devon Life is a treasure trove of fascinating objects and quirky artefacts that weave incredible stories about the people who lived here. A visit to Tiverton Museum offers a snapshot into what life was like in a buzzing market town, both at work and in the home. The museum is known for the Tivvy Bumper and attracts visitors from all over to experience the sound of this steam train.

Take a trip along the <u>Great Western Canal</u> on a <u>horse drawn barge</u>, there's lots of wildlife to spot. With crew dressed in clothing of a bygone era and with large Heavy Horses (including Shires) at the ready. The Brind family are proud to operate one of the very last Horse-Drawn Barges in Great Britain!

The historic <u>Pannier Market</u> building is located at the core of the town. This plays host to general markets during weekdays and award-winning street food night market events monthly during the summer season. The town is full of independent shops and boutiques ready to welcome visitors, you can discover handmade crafts, local produce and find unique gifts.

EAT & DRINK

Famous for its fresh, local produce, farmers' markets and stunning quality flavours, Mid Devon is a food lover's heaven.

From cosy tea rooms to fine dining. Enjoy a pleasant walk or cycle ride and stop at one of our country pubs, micro-breweries or vineyards.

Tiverton Pannier Market is popular with visitors and welcome coach parties to sample their produce. The area has multiple award-winning eateries where you can sample local cuisine within the town centre in the cafes and restaurants. The <u>Grand Western Canal</u>, which is home to the <u>Ducks Ditty</u> and <u>Canal Tea Room</u>, is a perfect treat for groups to experience afternoon tea or light lunch.

Visit one of our many farm shops where you can pick your own strawberries, pack a picnic and enjoy lunch in the countryside (see our <u>Farm Shop and Farmers' Market trail</u> to taste your way across Mid Devon!).

COACH PARKING

Coaches can drop off visitors at Tiverton bus station. Free coach parking in Tiverton is located at William Street Car park and then park in the carpark.
